# A Heroic Journey of Recovery and Resilience

Associated with one of the bravest heroes of Greek mythology, Perseus is also one of the most resilient shelter cats Berkeley Humane has known. Transferred from a local public shelter that recognized Berkeley Humane's ability to provide top-level care, Perseus arrived in extreme pain, trembling uncontrollably.

Found as a stray with no known history, it was clear he had been suffering for a long time. X-rays revealed severe erosion of his left femoral head, severely limiting his hip's range of motion and causing a painful limp.

#### Struggle to Snuggles: Yogi's Journey

It's a mystery how such a small dog survived the streets of Antioch, severely neglected and struggling on his own. When he arrived at Berkeley Humane, he was quiet and reflective, so we named him Yogi. Our medical team quickly noticed multiple health issues affecting his quality of life, including mild dental disease, a skin infection called pyoderma, likely caused by poor nutrition, and a painful physical condition known as luxating patella.

A luxating patella, unfortunately common in small breed dogs, causes the kneecap to slide in and out of place, making walking very uncomfortable and painful for Yogi. Determined to make his life pain-free, our team realized his severe case required urgent surgery.



#### SAVING LIVES FROM THE VALLEY

Berkeley Humane collaborates with a crisis animal rescue team dedicated to transporting dogs from the Central Valley to our medical program. The Kern Project specializes in rescuing dogs from under-resourced shelters and the community, whether they have been intentionally abandoned in fields or found as strays.

Due to ongoing challenges in accessing veterinary care across the Central Valley, dogs from this region frequently require urgent medical attention. Puppies, in particular, are vulnerable to contracting the life-threatening Canine Parvovirus. Perseus underwent a femoral head ostectomy (FHO) and left patella repair, two critical surgeries to alleviate his pain and restore mobility. For eight weeks, he received physical therapy three times a day, overseen by his dedicated volunteer foster. His foster even adjusted their work schedule to ensure they could be home to care for Perseus, during his rehabilitation.

Thanks to the combined efforts of his foster and Berkeley Humane's animal care team, Perseus now walks painfree and has regained his playful spirit. His transformation from a trembling, pain-ridden stray to a well-cared-for feline in a new home is a testament to the generosity and compassion of those who supported him. Perseus now enjoys sunbathing by the window, chasing his favorite toys, and is living a life full of comfort and joy.
