

Love is Blind

At just seven-months-old, Dream was a sweet, cuddly, and playful kitten, despite her battle against a progressive and painful eye infection that would take her sight. Dream was transferred into our care with severely scarred and ulcerated eyes that were no longer responding to treatment. As her health quickly deteriorated, our medical team jumped into action to perform a double enucleation surgery—the only way to save her life.



Although we were certain that surgery was the best option, we also knew that Dream's recovery would be long, and that she would need love, patience and support as she adapts to blindness. Our medical team continued to monitor Dream, while an experienced foster tended to her daily care. To our surprise, Dream bounced back almost immediately!

Just hours after surgery, Dream expressed interest in toys. It wasn't long at all before she found her way, was eating and moving on her own, and got adopted!



She adjusted to our home super easily. Jumping [with] confidence immediately :)



2019-2023 **Intake by County**



Clyde and Mr. Cuddles were used to a guiet life, a peaceful home, for almost ten years. Our top priority was to find them a similar living situation and to keep the bonded pair together.

On January 5, 2023, Kalia arrived on the first flight of the new year from Hawai'i as a great candidate for our Aloha Dog project. With little chance of getting adopted at an overcrowded municipal island shelter, we were confident she would be welcomed quickly into a new loving family here on the mainland. Kalia was an alert four-year-old who loved every dog and person who crossed her path. She was a hands-down favorite of the volunteers and staff. Yet, week after week, she was passed over for adoption.

Not all dogs do well in a kennel environment, but Kalia seemed to thrive. She received constant attention, a minimum of three walks a day, and all the canine playgroups she could handle. She was everyone's best friend. But soon the weeks turned into months. Was Kalia aware that every week...

SPAYIE BAY

Since the inception of Spay the Bay in 2016, we have seen ever increasing demand for affordable veterinary care. As we emerge from the Covid-19 pandemic, our community continues to grapple with the rippling economic effects of inflation.

Thanks to your support and donations, we are able to sustain our program, and continue to offer low cost vaccines, spay and neuter surgeries, microchips, and various other medical services to our community's pet guardians who want to provide the best care to their furry family members despite challenging times.

In 2023, Spay the Bay served 1,313 of our community's dogs and cats, providing 340 core vaccines, 548 spay and neuter surgeries, and 425 microchips.


