Some stories test our patience. Kenzie's tested our hearts.

Kenzie holds an unfortunate record at Berkeley Humane as the longest stay of any dog in our care. She waited more than 500 days for a family to call her own. But those 500 days were not empty. They were filled with healing, small victories, and love.

During that time, Kenzie moved through several foster homes. Each one gave her exactly what she needed: a soft bed, a steady routine, patient care, and sometimes even a playful canine companion. Foster care was

PETIE: Rescued on the Road, Loved All the Way Home

In October 2025, Petie's life changed in an instant when a woman spotted him injured in the middle of a four-lane road in Oakland. Suspected of being hit by a car, Petie was badly hurt. Yet even in pain, he was incredibly sweet and trusting. The woman rushed him to a veterinarian, and when it became clear his injuries would require extensive care, she reached out to Berkeley Humane for help. Because of compassionate supporters like you, Petie received the urgent medical care he needed. His treatment included care for fractures to his pelvis, amputation of his tail, and surgery to restore his comfort and mobility. Your generosity made it possible for Petie to receive the specialized care he needed to heal.

Petie's story became even more remarkable because the woman who rescued him stayed by his side. She opened her home as his foster caregiver and supported him through every step of recovery. When Petie was healthy enough, she made their bond permanent and adopted him.

Petie's journey shows what compassion and community can do together. Thanks to supporters like you, injured and vulnerable animals receive lifesaving care and the chance to find the loving homes they deserve.

BRAVEHEART: A Grateful Patient Story of Hope and Healing

Braveheart's life began with hardship no puppy should ever endure. In the chaos of a domestic violence situation, he suffered serious injuries to both of his front legs, injuries so painful that every step was a struggle.

When Braveheart arrived at Berkeley Humane, his journey toward healing began. Thanks to donors like you, he received the specialized veterinary care he urgently needed.

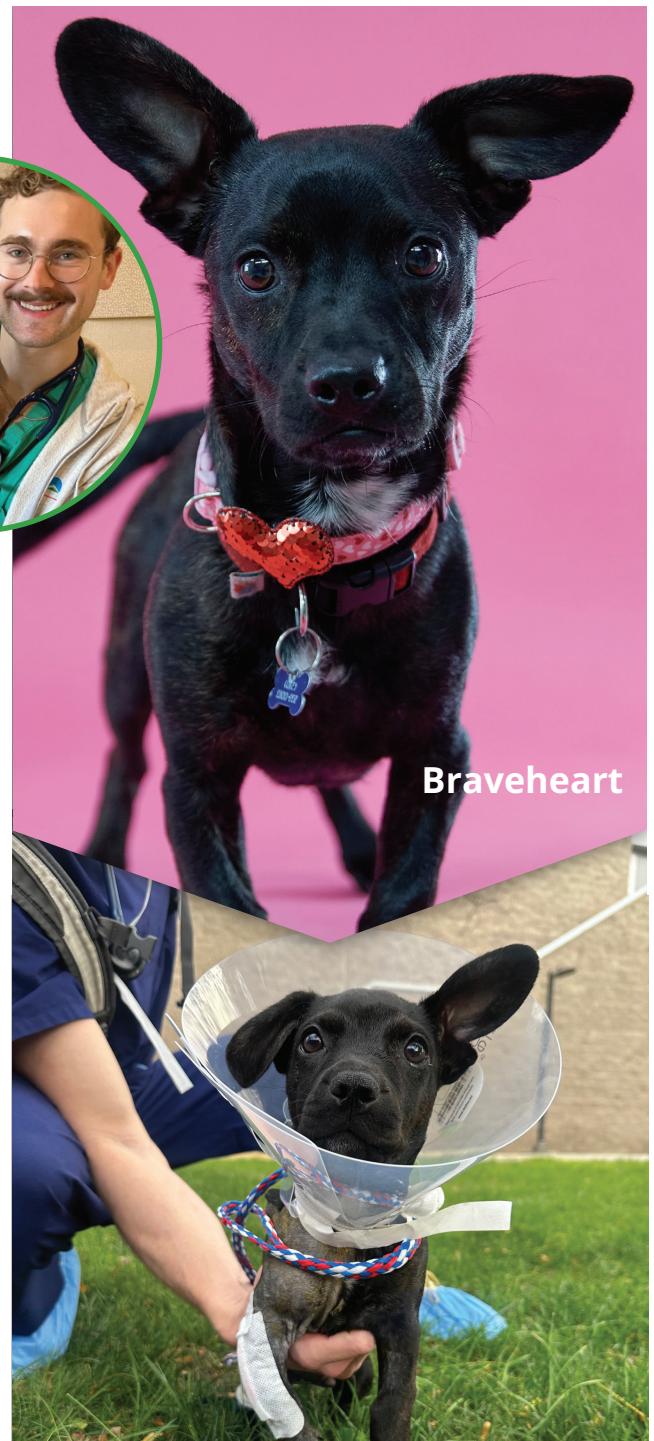

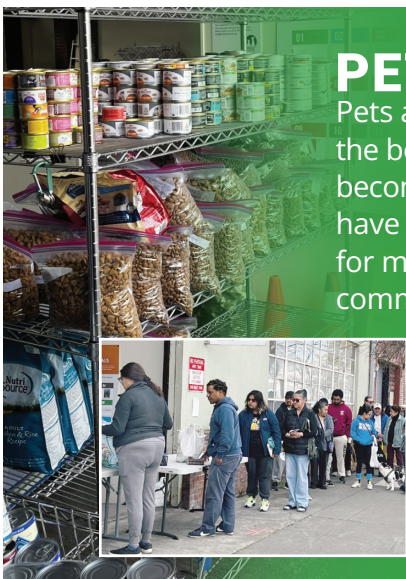
PET FOOD PANTRY

Pets are family. During challenging times, the bond between people and their animals becomes even more important. Rising costs have made daily life harder to manage for many families, but their love and commitment to their pets never wavers.

The reality is that when people are struggling financially and must decide between feeding themselves or feeding their pet, they will prioritize their pets' needs, choosing to go hungry

themselves. To keep pet families together we distributed over 6,930 pounds (almost 3.5 tons!) of pet food to 888 families, helping ensure beloved animals remain healthy, cared for, and right where they belong: at home with their families.

This work would not be possible without you. We are grateful to our volunteers for giving time and compassion, and to you for supporting our safety net services. Because of you, pets and the people who love them can stay together.

CALIFORNIA ADOPT-A-PET DAY & PINTS FOR PAWS

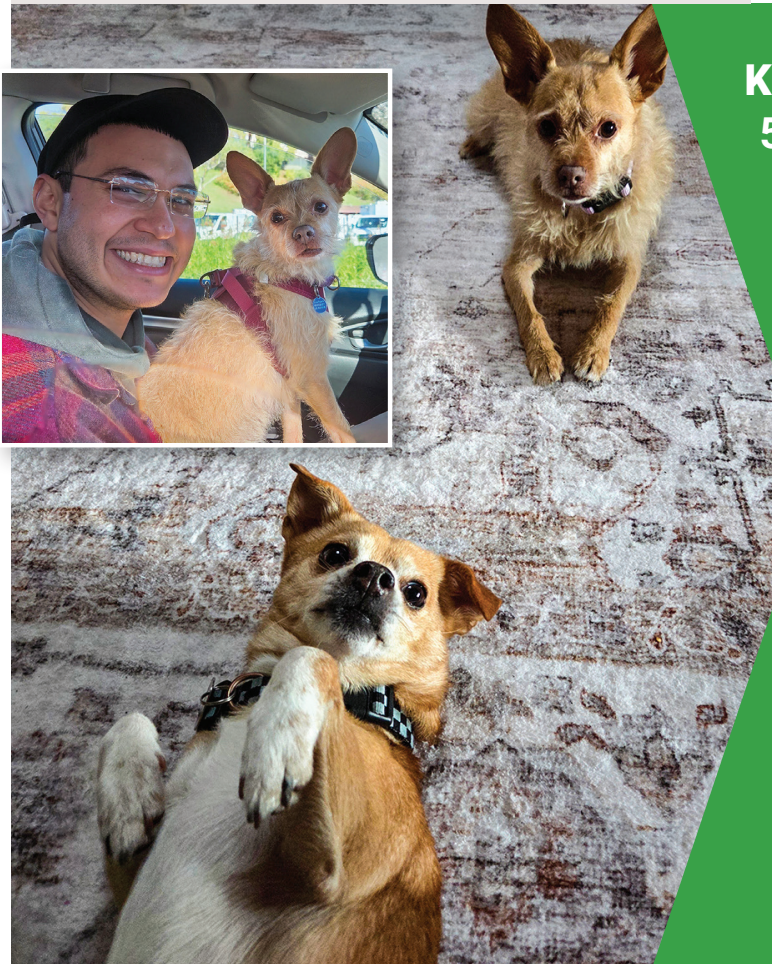
Two Celebrations with Purpose
